✓ **Strategic vision statement**

The Africa Regional Collaborative Platform (RCP) seeks to bring the power of the regional UNDS collective strength and collaborative potential to bear on catalyzing and accelerating actions towards the achievements of the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063 on the continent. The purpose of the Africa RCP is to harness the large body of existing knowledge and practice within the regional UNDS in an integrated and holistic manner to provide optimal solutions to address Africa's transformational goals. It also aims to avoid duplication of effort and upscale collaboration to achieve greater country-level impact. The RCP positions its collective assets as a tool to assist RCs/ UNCTs to better support countries in delivering on the 2030 Agenda and Agenda 2063. Promoting a unified UNDS policy voice, the Africa RCP seeks to foster cross-pillar collaboration and joined-up interagency strategies and actions, through the reinforced Opportunity & Issue Based Coalitions (OIBCs) informed by the outcomes of the Annual RCP Retreat held on 17-18 November 2022 in Dakar, Senegal. The RCP seeks to engender lasting transformational change and ensure effective linkages between regional, sub-regional and national dimensions, including regional and sub-regional integration and transboundary actions.

Critical to its work is the engagement and collaboration with key strategic regional partners such as the African Union Commission and Secretariats of the Regional Economic Communities (RECs), which will be anchored around the AU-UN Framework on the Implementation of Agenda 2063 and 2030 Agenda, and AU-UN Framework for Enhanced Partnership on Peace and Security in Africa. In addition to driving implementation of the SG's recommendations #2 and #3, the Africa RCP will lead efforts to make the UNDS more efficient through streamlined operating practices and consolidation of back offices, resulting in both efficiency gains and higher quality services (recommendation 5).
